## ADMISSIONS CRITERIA FOR 2019-2020

### ADMISSIONS CRITERIA (ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY)

#### ✓ ADMINISTRATIVE CRITERIA

- o Apply for registration during the official period (No later than the last working day of October 2018)
- o Submit a complete application including all required documents. (Attention: originals are required.)
- o Participate in the mandatory information session (**all "new" elementary and secondary parents/guardians**) in order to be eligible for the draw.

#### ✓ TERRITORY CRITERION

##### Francophone Sector

- ✓ 100% of young people must have their principle residence in the territory of the Commission Scolaire de Montréal (CSDM).

#### ENGLISH SECTOR:

##### ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY

- ✓ English Montreal School Board (EMSB) parents/guardians must provide with proof of eligibility to attend the Anglophone sector.
- ✓ **LANGUAGE CRITERIA:** Knowledge of the language of instruction (French) is compulsory on the CSDM side for kindergarten. The school does not offer classroom or language support.
- ✓ **CRITERIA OF INTEREST FOR ARTS:** Students must have an interest in the four arts forms in elementary and high school (vocal music, instrumental music, visual arts and drama).
- ✓ **CRITERIA FOR ACADEMIC SUCCESS** (from the second cycle of elementary school):  
Students must have a school record indicating no particular difficulties. The requirements of the FACE program require rather autonomous students: no failure at the end of the school year in basic subjects at the end of the year (French, mathematics for CSDM students and English and mathematics for students EMSB)
- ✓ **"STUDENT PROFILE" CRITERION** (secondary only):
  - o Interest in the arts and understanding of its aspects
  - o Proficiency in the language of instruction (English for the EMSB)
  - o Socialization
  - o Independence

**IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE ADMISSION CRITERIA AND IN THE FOLLOWING ORDER, CSDM**

1. Students in the EMSB who must change School Boards for legal reasons are not prioritized before all new admissions. Students must be able to satisfy the requirements of the French-speaking side. (A test must be passed by students considering to join the CSDM; no language support is offered.)
2. Siblings from the same home have priority. They are to be registered at FACE in the year in which an application is admissible on condition that they meet all the admission criteria (There is also a lottery within even when spots are limited.)
3. Young people in random order in the draw.

**PLEASE NOTE**

- ✓ The school welcomes up to 25% of special needs students. The school therefore reserves the right to refuse a child who presents particular difficulties which would require an accompaniment which it cannot offer or if it considers that it cannot adequately meet the needs of a young person.
- ✓ Students in the school who wish to move from the French-speaking to the Anglophone (or vice-versa, without obligation to do so) are not prioritized in the admission process. They must apply for admission during the official registration period and are subject to the draw like other prospective students.
- ✓ At the secondary level, 5 applications (maximum) can be prioritized according to their musical profile and according to the respect of the ratios agreed.
- ✓ A student who is under the age prescribed by law may obtain a waiver of the eligibility age (in kindergarten) in accordance with the procedure established by the School Board. However, the establishment management reserves the right to re-evaluate a derogation granted. The parent must provide the professional assessment supporting the claim for exemption within ten (10) working days of the application. If the school does not receive the required documents within ten (10) working days of the application, the student's application will be canceled.
- ✓ Considering that the arts occupy more than a third of the time devoted to the school, a young person must therefore have, throughout his/her school career, a marked interest for the arts in order to develop and to flourish fully. It is therefore essential that parents/guardians ensure the artistic interest of their child and, if necessary, make a new choice along the way for the good of their child. A student who loses this interest in the arts would therefore be obliged to make the necessary change of a new milieu.
- ✓ Given that multi-grade level instruction is impossible at FACE and that repetition is difficult to offer since our cohorts are not split, a student in a situation of failure of his/her grade could be under academic review. The administration has the obligation to put in place the means recommended by the school or present the obligation to enroll the student in another school.



## FACE LEXICON

### **Homeroom (also called Family Class)**

Refers to students in the same class under the responsibility of a teacher.

### **Siblings**

Children of the same homeroom - family class.

**Primary Residence** where a person predominantly resides - being understood that the student is the place where he/she lives during the whole week (Monday to Friday). However, in cases of shared custody, the primary residence is that of one parent/guardian; it is determined by both parents/guardians at the time of enrollment and remains in effect for the entire school year, subject to the removal of one of the parents/guardians.

### **Neighborhood School**

An elementary or secondary school with no particular project that welcomes pupils from a territory defined by the School Board and where instruction is given according to the pedagogical methods designed for the majority of pupils.

### **Out-of-Territory Student**

Student who does not come under the jurisdiction of the Commission Scolaire de Montréal but can attend a school like FACE after an annual schooling agreement, territorial agreement, written and approved with its original School Board, pursuant to section 213 of the PIA.

### **Territory**

The territory of the FACE school is that of the entire territory of the Commission scolaire de Montréal (francophone side). Although the school is located in territory 12 (Grand-Plateau) and at the boundary of territories 13 (Ville-Marie) and 18 (Westmount), the school must reserve 15% of places for youth in Territory 18 (Westmount). *There is no territory agreement that impedes EMSB students from attending FACE School.*

### **Special Needs Students**

Students who are physically handicapped or have difficulty learning.

### **Territorial Agreement**

An agreement between the CSDM and parents/guardians to enroll a student from another territory.

## NUMBER OF ADMISSIONS (APPROXIMATELY)

The number of places is determined by the number of pupils currently enrolled at every level and by the number of departures announced. We can however estimate that it is detailed as follows:

### Preschool and elementary

- ✓ Kindergarten: 68 places (CSDM) + 30 places (EMSB)
- ✓ Grades 1 to 6 CSDM and CSEM: 3 to 4 places per level

### Secondary CSDM and EMSB

- ✓ 1st secondary: about 45 places CSDM, 15 places EMSB
- ✓ Secondary 2 to Secondary V: 3 to 4 places per level.
